e.g. No. 9c: "Significantly increase access to information and communications technology and strive to provide universal and affordable access to the Internet in least developed countries by 2020."












































How is ICT4D organized in International Development?







How to design and build solutions for complex environments?




Innovation: a networked process of knowledge exchange





A non-linear approach asks for a adaptive, collaborative approach




